LAW ENFORCEMENT CHARGING & LOCAL JAIL USE

CHALLENGE

Give law enforcement more options for handling lowlevel, non-violent charges and connect vulnerable people with help rather than booking into jail when appropriate.

126% arrests for criminal charges

cite-and-release 46% for low-level nonviolent charges

PROGRESS

REAL-TIME TRIAGE SERVICES

Tri-County Crisis Stabilization Center opened in 2017 with 10 beds and 492 referrals (from all sources).

Sobering Center to open in 2018

42% familiar faces cycling through jail

Target single charge bookings (open container, public intox., trespass, shoplifting, simple poss. marijuana)

13% local jail population

PRETRIAL JUSTICE

CHALLENGE

75% or releases ... _ return to jail pretrial of releases on bond

91% of people in our jail are awaiting trial

PROGRESS

Pretrial services report launched January 2018 to help make bond setting more risk-based.

Automated court reminders to launch in 2018.



Additional options for improving pretrial outcomes (i.e., safety and appearance) are being explored.



CHALLENGE

A racially equitable justice system is vital for the well-being of our community.



PROGRESS

Reductions in Black: White disproportionality:

4% Local Bookings

29% Target Charge Bookings

13% Criminal Bench Warrants

CHALLENGE

Local justice system data exist in numerous separate agency databases. This makes it difficult to see the whole picture and track progress.

The CJCC data warehouse now receives data from 14 different agencies. This enables us to use data analysis to guide ongoing improvements.
